



HEALTH NEWS

The Episcopal Church encourages all adults to have an advance directive. An advance directive lets you say how you wish to be treated medically if you are no longer able to speak for yourself. It incorporates a "living will (what you would want done if you were dying) and a "durable power of attorney for health care" (what you would want done if you were in a non-fatal situation, but could not speak for yourself because of a coma or dementia, etc.)

Anyone 18 or older. If you are young, you can be unconscious a very long time.

- 1. Choosing a health care agent
- 2. Treatment you want or DO not want

Who should have an Advance Directive?

- 3. How comfortable you want to be
- How you wish people to treat you
- What you want your loved ones to know

*LOVED ONES DO NOT HAVE TO GUESS WHAT YOU WANTED DONE OR NOT DONE. *FAMILY MEMBERS CAN WORK TOGETHER TO FULFILL YOUR WISHES INSTEAD OF FIGHTING FOR OPPOSING TREATMENTS

(Above information provided by National Episcopal Health Ministries) *Five Wishes* meets the legal requirements for an advance directive in 40 states and is used in all 50 states as an easy way to communicate preferences to family members and health care providers. *Five Wishes* is an advance directive, or living will, which helps people make important decisions that address their medical, personal, emotional and **spiritual** needs ahead of a health crisis. (**United Health Foundation and Aging with Dignity**)
